

"Report on EVS trip"

Shree Mahavir Education Society's, Mahavir Institute of Pharmacy had organised an Environmental Studies (EVS) trip for the first-year B. Pharmacy students to Pandavleni, a historical and natural site located in Nashik, Maharashtra. The trip aimed to provide students with an opportunity to observe and understand the importance of environmental conservation, natural resources, and the cultural heritage associated with the region. - The trip provided students with the opportunity to interact with locals and learn about the cultural traditions and practices in the area.




- Students also explored the connection between traditional medicine and modern pharmacy.
