- 2. **Recruitment Drives:** After the presentation, interviews were conducted in two rounds 1st the HR round followed by the Technical round. The students were segregated into 3 categories according to the requirements and students' interests i.e. CDM (Clinical Data Management), VRA (Virtual Radiology), and Medical Scribe trainee respectively.
- 3. **Feedback Sessions:** Company personnel provided feedback to students after the recruitment process, offering valuable insights into areas for improvement and development. This feedback loop was instrumental in helping students understand their strengths and weaknesses and tailor their career strategies accordingly.

The pool campus event proved to be a resounding success with the participation of a maximum of 500+ students, with almost **48 students** secured job offers for various openings in various departments like Medical Scribe, Virtual Radiology, and Clinical Data Management and valuable connections with industry professionals. Companies also benefited from the event by identifying talented individuals who could contribute to their organizations. The event facilitated meaningful interactions and collaborations.


